

Chipsealing in central Carterton

13 November 2018

We would like to advise you of road resurfacing works scheduled for State Highway 2 in central Carterton, covering about 470 metres from just south of Pembroke Street to Rexwood Street. Chipsealing is scheduled for Monday night 19 November, weather permitting. This will be followed by two days with a 30km/h temporary speed restriction to settle the seal and for road-sweeping.

What and when

- Chipsealing
- Monday 19 November, 6.30pm-5.30am
- Settling period
- Tuesday 20 November, Wednesday21 November
- 30km/h temporary speed restriction

How will this work affect neighbours?

While we always aim to do our work with as little disruption as possible, we know roadworks can be inconvenient due to machinery noise. The crew understand they are working near people's homes and will keep noise to a minimum as much as possible.

Stop/go traffic control will manage the flow of vehicles along the highway during the works.

There will be times when works are taking place across driveways and the intersections with side streets, restricting your access for a short period. Our traffic controllers will assist people to access their driveways.

No parking will be available on the roadside during the work. Please ensure your car is off the road. We always attempt to find the owners but if we have no choice but to tow a vehicle, it will be to a safe spot outside the work site or to the nearest side street.
