DECISION

This is an application by **Veronica & Anisha Investments Limited** for a **BYO On-licence Endorsed** in respect of premises situated at **109 High Street North, Carterton**, known as Indian Taj.

The general nature of the business to be undertaken is that of an Indian Restaurant.

The application was duly advertised and no objection or notice of desire to be heard has been received. Accordingly we deal with the matter on the papers.

We are satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.105 of the Act and we grant the applicant an on-licence endorsed BYO.

The applicant's attention is drawn to Section 14 to 16, and 64 Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012

Section 37 of the Act applies to this licence.

Pursuant to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (the **Act**), **Veronica & Anisha Investments Limited** – licensee of **Indian Taj** situated at 109 High Street North, Carterton is authorized to:

1. Allow any person who is on the premises to dine, to consume any alcohol brought there by that person or by any other person who is there to dine with him or her; and
2. Allow the person who brought the alcohol to the premises, to remove any of it from the restaurant if the container it is in, sealed or resealed; and
3. Allow people to consume alcohol there.

CONDITIONS

This licence is subject to the following conditions:

- a) Alcohol may be consumed only on the following days and during the following hours:

Monday to Saturday 11.00am to 10.00pm

- b) The following steps must be taken to promote the responsible consumption of alcohol: The premises are open for trade, a reasonable range of non-alcoholic refreshments.
- c) The following steps must be taken to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale restrictions on the supply of alcohol to minors and the complete prohibition on sales to intoxicated persons.
- d) Drinking water is to be freely available to customers while the premises are open for business from the service counter.
- e) The whole of the premises is designated as an undesignated area.
- f) Food must be available for consumption on the premises at all times when the premises are authorized to be open, a range of choices must be readily available. Menus must be visible and food should be actively promoted.
- g) The host responsibility policy must be displayed in view of the public. Signs must be prominently displayed detailing information regarding alternative forms of transport.

DISPLAY OF LICENCE AND PRINCIPAL ENTRANCE

Copy of this licence must be displayed at the principal entrance to the premises. The entrance from High Street North is designated as the principal entrance.

DURATION

Subject to the requirements of the Act relating to the payment of fees, and to the provisions of the Act relating to the suspension and cancellation of licenses, this licence continues in force-

- (a) until its expiry date dated at Carterton District Council, 24th January 2020
