

- One round per year
- Generally funds operational costs
- Priorities are locally set at public meetings

Council Community Funding

- Carterton DC
 - Community Grants

- South Wairarapa DC
 - Community Grants
 - Community Board Grants
 - Māori Standing Committee Grants
 - Marae Development Fund



Community Grants

- \$212,000 funded by Masterton
- \$250,000 (incl \$75,000 youth) South Wairarapa
- \$243,000 Carterton

[funding available is dependent on Annual Plan allocation and carried forward funding from prior years]





Creative Communities Scheme

- Funded by Creative New Zealand (varying amounts per district)
- Multiple funding rounds per year
- Fund criteria is:
 - Access and participation
 - Diversity
 - Young people
- Applications are assessed and funding allocated by a committee of assessors from the community

What is the KiwiSport Fund?

- KiwiSport is a government funding initiative administered by Sport Wellington to increase participation in sport, active recreation and play for school-aged children. The Wellington KiwiSport Regional Partnership Fund is allocated and distributed across the greater Wellington region (Wellington, Porirua, Hutt Valley, Kapiti Coast and Wairarapa). KiwiSport aims to:
- ✓ Increase the number of school-aged children participating in physical activity.
- ✓ Increase the availability and accessibility of physical activity opportunities for all school-aged children.
- ✓ Support children in developing skills that will enable them to participate effectively in physical activity.



The kiwisport fast-fund

- The recently introduced KiwiSport Fast Fund is for:
- ✓ Applications \$10,000 and below.
- ✓ Is open year-round.
- ✓ For initiatives/programmes delivering through until 30th November 2020.
- Applications can be made by completing the online form on the KiwiSport page of the Sport Wellington website.
- Once applications have been submitted, they are reviewed by the Sport Wellington Assessment Panel and CEO, with applicants being notified of the outcome of their submission shortly after.



Considerations for Funding Applications -

- Key requirements:
- ✓ Evidence of partnerships, alignment & organization credibility.
- ✓ Quality of programme delivery (monitoring & evaluation).
- ✓ Social and non-competitive opportunities.
- ✓ Evidence of participant voice, meeting participants needs, and Physical Literacy incorporated.
- Priorities for investment:
- ✓ Quality experiences with the three approaches incorporated Locally led delivery, insights and physical literacy.
- ✓ Low participation groups / communities.
- ✓ Increased focus on 12-18-year-olds.
- ✓ Coaching Quality & Quantity.
- ✓ Quality Intra and Inter-school sport.
- ✓ Skill Development and Confidence Building.
- ✓ Family and Community Engagement (particularly in low participation groups).
- ✓ Innovative approaches for females (10-18 years) participating in activities that meets their needs.





What can/Can't kiwisport be used for?

- KiwiSport funding can be used for:
- ✓ Programmes that deliver outside of curriculum time (before-school, lunchtime, after-school, weekends, holidays).
- ✓ Salary/wage expenses for a programme coordinator/facilitator/deliverer and staff.
- ✓ Facility hire.
- ✓ Delivery of specialized activities.
- ✓ In some instances, small transport and equipment costs associated with greater programme delivery.
- <u>KiwiSport Funding cannot be used for:</u>
- ✓ Programmes that only deliver during curriculum time.
- ✓ Applications for Capital Expenditure.
- ✓ Transport costs or accommodation for National (or International) Tournament attendance.
- ✓ Large equipment costs.

GRASS ROOTS FUND

- Aim is to ensure that communities have access to services, events and initiatives that they value
- ➤ To maintain valuable community services, events, clubs and other community initiatives
- To support a range of social and recreational activities
- Covers things like:
 - Operating and programme costs
 - Event costs
 - Equipment and small assets
 - Repairs and maintenance
- Quicker and simpler, online only

Grassroots Fund

GRASS ROOTS FUND

- Four Pathways
 - Participation funds community participation
 - Services funds the delivery of community services
 - Development funds community led consultation and planning, supports community leadership and capacity development.
 - Education support improved education opportunities and reduce barriers to participating in education.
 - Contestable fund
 - Two rounds April and August

Community Assets & Facilities Fund

CAFF

- Aim is to ensure that communities can access the community assets and facilities needed to meaningfully participate in community life
- > Two step funding application
 - > First step Expression of Interest
 - Second Step an invitation to complete a full capital works application

Community Assets & Facilities Fund

CAFF

- Contestable Fund
- Two funding rounds per annum
 - ➤ March and November Board Meetings
- Large capital works over \$150k
