**LOCAL GOVERNMENT OFFICIAL INFORMATION AND MEETINGS ACT Request: 2023-70 & 74**

Thank you for your emails of 26 September and 10 October 2023 to the Carterton District Council requesting the following information:

*“...who is responsible for the maintenance of vehicle crossings to privately owned property from the road access point to the property boundary.”*

And

*“Could you please advise how many residential properties were charged bonds for new vehicle crossings in Fantail av and Kea Court.  
Could you please advise how many bonds were released once vehicle crossings were completed in Fantail av and Kea Court.”*

Your request has been considered under the Local Government Official Information and Meeting Act 1987 (the Act).

Our response to your questions have been answered individually below.

***Who is responsible for the maintenance of vehicle crossings to privately owned property from the road access point to the property boundary?***

Maintenance of vehicle crossing on privately owned property from the road access point to the property boundary is the responsibility of the owner who privately owns the property.

***Could you please advise how many residential properties were charged bonds for new vehicle crossings in Fantail av and Kea Court.***

There are no bond charges for vehicle crossing in Fantail Avenue and Kea Court.

***Could you please advise how many bonds were released once vehicle crossings were completed in Fantail av and Kea Court.***

As there are no bond charges, we do not hold numbers of bonds issued.
